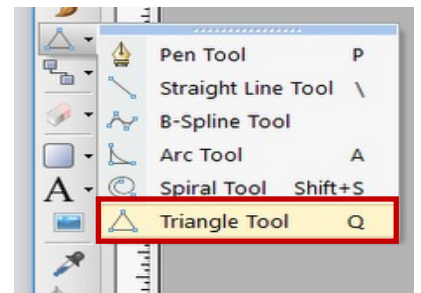

Description: This beginner tutorial is very basic. It will show you how to make a simple fir tree using shapes with various effects applied.

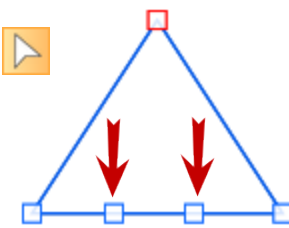
LET'S GET STARTED

This tutorial is for beginners and will give a little practice on using shapes, styles, and node editing.

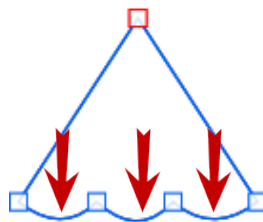
1. Open a new drawing in a size of your choice. Right-click on the ruler and set the measurement value to **Inches**.
2. Set the **Line** color to black and the **Fill** color to white.
3. Select the **Triangle** from the **Pen** tool fly-out on the **Drawing** toolbar. Double-click on the workspace to open the **QuickShape Creator**.
4. Set the **Width** to 1.75 in and the **Height** to 1.35 in. Ok.



5. Select the **Node** tool from the **Drawing** toolbar. Add two nodes evenly spaced to the bottom of the triangle by clicking on the line.



6. With the **Node** tool, pull down each of the three lines between the nodes to form a little arc.



7. Hold down the **CTRL** key, then using the **Pointer** tool, drag the triangle in any direction to create a duplicate.

8. Move the copy over the first triangle and position as shown. Use the **Pointer** tool to drag the sides out just a slight bit wider.

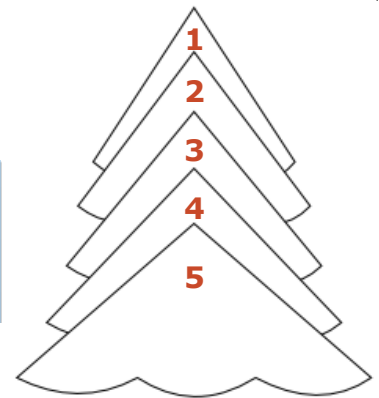
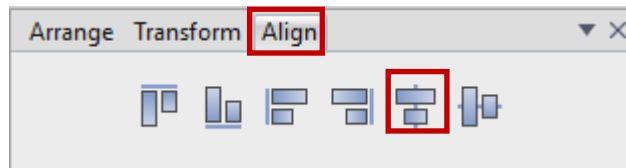


9. **Duplicate** the new image and repeat these two steps until you have a total of 5 layers. They will look backwards but we will fix that.

ARRANGING THE LAYERS

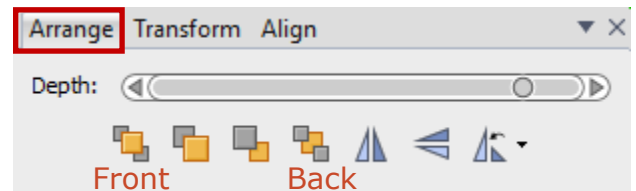
Your image should look like the one on the right side of the page.

1. Using the **Pointer** tool, drag a box around all the shapes.



2. On the **Align** tab, click the **Center Horizontally** icon.

3. Select the last triangle (#5) and click the **Send to Back** icon on the **Arrange** tab.



4. Select the third triangle (#3) and click the **Bring to Front** icon. Repeat **Bring to Front** for #2 and #1.

5. Your images should look like a tree at this point.

6. Select the **Quick Rectangle** from the **QuickShapes** on the **Drawing** toolbar. Drag out a rectangular shape for the tree stump.

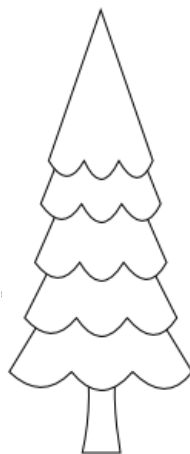
7. Right-click and **Convert to Curves**. Using the **Node** tool, drag in the center on each side of the rectangle. Position it in the center of the tree and **Send to Back**.



8. Save your basic shape in the **Gallery** so you can re-use it with different effects and colors. You can drag the tree in from the sides to make a skinny tree if you like.
