Description: This beginner tutorial will show you how to use the Roughen tool and how to create

a nice photo frame using this tool.

LET'S GET STARTED!

The **Roughen** tool is an interesting one to experiment with. It will turn an ordinary line into one that's full of little zig-zags. You can control the size and length of these zig-zags.

1. Open a new letter size DrawPlus drawing. Set the Line Color to black and the Fill to transparent.


2. Select the **Rectangle** from the QuickShapes on the Drawing toolbar and draw out a

rectangle.


3. The **Roughen** tool is located on the Drawing toolbar in the **Envelope** tool if lyout.

4. Select the **Roughen** tool and place your cursor in the upper middle of the rectangle.

5. While holding down the left mouse button, drag the cursor downward. The lines in the rectangle will start to show a zig-zag pattern. The farther down you drag the tool, the larger the zig-zag pattern. When you're happy with the look, release the mouse button.



If you don't like the effect, click on the corner.

Pretty interesting tool, isn't it? Try it on other shapes and and vary the amount of roughness.


You can edit the roughened rectangle by selecting **Tools\Convert to Curves** from the menu, then using the Node Edit tool to move the nodes around. Try it!


PHOTO FRAME

Let's use what we've learned to create a photo frame.


- 1. Start a new letter size drawing and draw out a large rectangle using the QuickShape **Rectangle** preset with black line color and transparent fill.
- 2. Use the **Roughen** tool to create a zig-zag border for your frame.
- 3. Using the **Align** tab, align your rectangle both vertically and horizontally on the screen. The **Align** tab should be visible on the lower right corner of your screen. If it's not, choose **View\Studio Tabs\Align Tab** from the menu.
- 4. Draw another rectangle inside of the first rectangle and align it both horizontally and vertically.








- 7. Use the **Pointer** tool to drag your frame from the center, then delete the part that was cut out.
- 8. Now all that's left is to fill your frame with color, maybe increase the line width, and insert a photo under it. Export your frame as a .png file (File\Export\Export as Picture) or save it to your Gallery for future use.
